

### Policy on Making a Complaint to the Human Ethics Committee

### **Purpose**

This policy outlines the process for making a complaint about any research involving human subjects conducted by or within the Institution. This could include concerns about ethical issues, participant safety, or non-compliance with approved protocols.

### Scope

This policy applies to anyone who wishes to make a complaint, including research participants, researchers, staff, or members of the public.

## **Policy Statement**

### 1. Complaint Submission

- Complaints should be submitted in writing and include the complainant's name and contact details, a clear description of the concerns, and any relevant supporting information.
- Complaints should be addressed to the Chair of the Human Research Ethics Committee and can be submitted by email ethics@isn.edu.au.

### 2. Confidentiality

- All complaints will be treated confidentially, and the identity of the complainant will only be disclosed as necessary to investigate the complaint or if required by law.
- Anonymous complaints will be accepted, but it may be more difficult to investigate these or provide a response to the complainant.

# 3. Non-Retaliation

• The Institution is committed to ensuring that individuals can make complaints without fear of retaliation. Any retaliation against a complainant will be treated as a serious breach of this policy.

#### Procedure

## 1. Receipt of Complaint

• The Chair of the Human Research Ethics Committee will acknowledge receipt of the complaint usually within a week of receiving it.

## 2. Assessment of Complaint

• The Chair and at least two other members of the Committee will assess the complaint to determine its validity.

### 3. Investigation

• If the complaint is valid, a formal investigation will be conducted.

## 4. Response

• The complainant will be informed of the outcome of the investigation and any actions taken.

## **Appeals**

If the complainant is not satisfied with the response, they can appeal to the Academic Board, following the complaints procedure outlined in ISN Psyhcology Policies and Procedures.
