Career Pathways

Graduates of the Master of Psychology (Sport & Exercise) undertake placements in a number of sport and exercise organisations, schools, gyms, in the performing Arts, and private practice. This breadth of potential placement opportunities, and the experience they represent, positions our students to hit the ground running in their careers as Sport and Exercise Psychologists.

Theory into Practice

Graduates of this course are eligible to enter the PsyBA registrar program to pursue endorsement as Sport and Exercise Psychologists. To develop general psychological skills, students complete core units in psychological ethics, assessment, basic interventions, and research.

Master of **Psychology (Sport & Exercise)**

This program is designed to prepare students for professional practice. The key learnings from this course include vital skills and knowledge centred around understanding psychological factors that contribute to peak performance and wellbeing.

Exploration of these factors includes consideration of psychological assessment, ethics in sport and exercise psychology, sports medicine, prevention, treatment, and rehabilitation from injury, team dynamics and group culture, and the application of psychological interventions to optimise wellbeing and performance.

Students will be guided in their training by accomplished sport and exercise psychologists, and will have opportunities to secure placements in professional sporting and exercise organisations. Evidence-based approaches are used to not only enhance performance, but to provide expertise in a broad range of areas. This course is accredited by the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC).

Entry Requirements

- The minimum academic entry requirement is the completion of an APAC accredited 4th year of study at an average equivalence across units of 70%.
- Applicants who can demonstrate that they are currently registered as a psychologist and complying with the CPD requirements of the Psychology Board of Australia (PsyBA) will be exempted from the aforementioned entry requirements and considered for entry into the postgraduate course based on experience in the field.
- Applicants must be eligible for registration as a provisional psychologist with PsyBA. Successful candidates will be asked to apply for provisional registration and provide a police check, working with children check and evidence of appropriate professional indemnity insurance and/or APS membership as part of the enrolment process.
- Only domestic students with Australian citizenship or Permanent Residency rights (or New Zealand Citizenship) can apply. ISN cannot currently accept applications for international students.
- Candidates must meet minimum English language proficiency standards for entry to the course.
- Permanent residency students and/or students who have obtained their qualifications from overseas, in addition to providing their APS documentation for equivalency, need to demonstrate acceptable International English Language Testing System (IELTS) scores. An overall minimum of 7.0 with no band less than 7 is expected.

Students who completed their undergraduate studies overseas but meet the domestic student criteria can apply for this course. ISN requires evidence of course equivalence in the form of an APS assessment document for all international qualifications.

Phase One

Domestic student status and academic entry requirements from applicants will be reviewed. The only accepted results come from an APAC accredited four-year sequence of study in psychology. The greatest weighting is given to the fourth year, and students must be eligible to register as a provisional psychologist with the Psychology Board of Australia (PsyBA).

Phase Two

Candidates that meet phase one entry requirements will be ranked based on academic ability and all supporting documentation including CVs, personal statements, and referee reports.

Phase Three

Select candidates will be shortlisted, and interviews and/or assessments will be conducted with those shortlisted candidates through the ISN Psychology admission selection panel.

Phase Four

Candidates that have successfully completed their selection interviews and assessments will be ranked based on their performance in those interviews and assessments.

Phase Five

Selected candidates will have their official offer of enrolment sent out based on final rankings throughout the phase process and yearly intake quotas.

Selection Process

Admission to this course is competitive.

We consider academic achievement, relevant experience, and interview/assessment outcomes. Prospective students are required to submit a 500-word personal statement outlining the following:

- Why you are interested in a Sport and Exercise psychology program;
- Why you are applying for this program rather than another health discipline or scope of practice:
- What makes you a suitable candidate;
- Any particular psychology interests or passions you may have;
- Your relevant skills, work and personal experiences; and
- A diversity statement that is, describe what professional or personal skills, experience or community engagement demonstrate your commitment to sensitivity and awareness of diversity issues (e.g. gender, culture, ethnicity, sexuality, etc.).

The selection process is a five phase process that includes academic reviews, candidate ranking, interviews/assessments, and final offers based on merit and intake capacity.

Tuition and Course Structure

This Master course consists of 17 core units, designed around a full-time study load of two years including four 12 week semesters. Each unit is informed by cutting-edge best practice and taught, whenever possible, in a contemporary hybrid model combining online and in-person learning.

ISN Psychology has developed placement agreements with various organisations to provide dynamic opportunities for sport and exercise psychologists in training to:

- Work with clients on setting goals as additional service to compliment the coaches.
- Engage in small group psychoeducation on key psychological skills training topics as is relevant to the business.
- Run individual/group sessions aimed at such aspects as passive recovery (i.e relaxation training).

Course work in the first year of the program will provide students with the academic foundations and therapeutic skills needed for placement. The second year of the program has a strong focus on integration of skills through external placements and advanced course units. Students will complete a systematic review as part of the program in a sports and/or exercise focused area of research.

Tuition fees are payable upfront or through FEE HELP for eligible students. All fees are subject to annual CPI increases, and the fees shown in this guidebook reflect the tuition for 2024 and may not be accurate to years following. Year on year fee increases will be indicated on the ISN Psychology website.
